OPINION BY ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE FREEMAN ON RESPONDENT'S MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

The Government moves for reconsideration of our decision of 10 August 2000 denying its motion to dismiss. The Government argues that because "Spectro Sort" represented in its bid that it was a corporation, the only possible contractor in this matter was the entity named "Spectro Sort, Inc.," a corporation whose corporate powers were suspended and which lacked the capacity to contract. We rejected this argument in our first decision, and we remain unpersuaded by its repetition. *See Winfield Manufacturing Company*, ASBCA No. 35743, 36046, 89-3 BCA ¶ 22,212.

The Government continues to ignore the fact that the contract was bid and awarded in the name of "Spectro Sort", a fictitious business name of Mr. Dennis Berlin. It was not bid and awarded in the name of "Spectro Sort, Inc.", the suspended corporation. In the cases cited by the Government, the named awardee was a suspended or dissolved corporation which lacked the legal capacity to contract. In the present case, the named awardee is a fictitious business name of a natural person who did not lack the legal capacity to contract in that name.

The motion for reconsideration is denied.
