Of the Board's 1,066 active appeals, the Army has 263 (24.7%), the Navy has 121 (11.4%), the Air Force has 102 (9.6%), the Corps of Engineers has 329 (30.9%), DLA and DCMA have 229 (21.5%), and the remaining 19 appeals (2.1%) are from other sources.

During FY 2014, there were 33 elections to have appeals processed under Board Rule 12 (18 expedited and 15 accelerated), 1 application under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 15 motions for reconsideration, and 1 court remand. At the conclusion of FY 2014, there were 8 appeals being processed under Board Rule 12 (5 expedited and 3 accelerated), 1 application under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 7 motions for reconsideration, and 1 court remand pending.

In FY 2014, the Board disposed of 109 appeals on the merits. Of those dispositions, 55.0% of the decisions found merit in whole or in part. The Board dismissed 426 appeals. In the majority of cases, a dismissal reflects that the parties have reached a settlement. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit (CAFC) docketed 12 appeals from Board decisions, and 7 appeals, all docketed in FY 2014, were pending at the close of the fiscal year. During the fiscal year, the CAFC disposed of 11 appeals involving ASBCA decisions, all of which were dismissed. Portions of an ASBCA decision, reviewed by the Court of Federal Claims (COFC), under its Wunderlich jurisdiction, and appealed to the CAFC, were remanded to the Board for further fact finding. The U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California entered a final judgment on a maritime appeal of a Board decision, affirming in part and reversing in part the Board's determinations.

During FY 2014, parties requested the Board's ADR services 28 times, covering 48 appeals and 1 undocketed dispute. Twenty-six requests were for nonbinding ADR and 2 requests, covering 5 matters, were for binding ADR. Twelve of the requests received during the year were pending at the close of the fiscal year. One FY 2013 request, involving one matter, was withdrawn. Of the 31 requests concluded during the year, not limited to FY 2014 requests, 2 requests, covering 5 matters were for binding ADR and 28 requests, covering 67 matters, were for nonbinding ADR. All were successfully resolved.
